WHAT IS TISSUE MOBILISATION

Tissue mobilisation involves the application of manual techniques such as pressure, compression, bending, longitudinal gliding, cross fibre work, kneading, stretching and rolling the tissues - the purpose of which is to stretch and release the soft tissue of the body.

The soft tissue includes muscles, tendons, ligaments, nerves and fascia (connective tissue). Working the soft tissue releases structural (bone/joint) changes in the physical body that may be the result of injury, pain and/or muscle imbalance.

What are the benefits of Tissue Mobilisation?

- restore range of motion to stiff joints
- relieve muscular tightness, spasms or restrictions improve muscle tone and balance
- reduce the physical stress placed on bones and joints
- reduce muscle fatigue and soreness by promoting rapid removal of toxins and waste products from the tissues
- increase flexibility in the muscles
- bring more oxygen and nutrients into the muscle by increasing blood circulation

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- On completion of the course graduates will be qualified in Tissue Mobilisation for Horses
- Graduates will be professional practitioners able to assess and treat general muscle pain and disorder, and assist in the maintenance of sport horses.
- They will have a good understanding of anatomy, biomechanics and equine assessment and, and will not only be able to treat horses but also be able to plan rehabilitation plans for the future.
- As this course is accredited by the Equine Therapies Association of Australia (ETAA), and the International Institute of Complimentary Therapies (IICT) graduates will be able to take up membership in the ETAA and IICT and receive access to insurance etc.

PREREQUISITES

Applicants are required to already have a qualification or extensive experience in the equine bodywork industry.

COURSE DURATION

Students have up to six months to complete the course, although it can be completed in 12 months if required.

The course includes:

- 100 hours of guided study
- 30 hours of guided practical experience
- 60 hours of external practical experience
- 200 hours of self guided study

ASSESSMENT

To graduate students must undertake all course hours and study questions, complete case studies on 15 horses, and complete a research project.

DELIVERY

This course offers combined delivery options of self guided and guided study via distance and online education as well as practical workshops.

There are two delivery options: 1) Practical 2) Distance

1. The practical version allows the student to complete the study modules and assessment over 1 year with all practical taking place in one 3 day intensive.
2. The Distance Option does not certify students until they have completed the practical component. It does allow them to gain all the theory and practical experience though. It is purely the theory side and students gain a "Certificate of Completion" in the course at the end.
